What is the committee working on?

1 Training

Development and implementation of training for law enforcement, prosecutors, victim advocates, state agency personnel, court personnel, and the community including information on U and T visas, legal protections for immigrant survivors, and promising practices in working with immigrant crime victims.

3 Monitoring

The committee will be monitoring compliance with RCW 7.98 including data collection and reporting from certifying agencies.

2 Information

The committee will be disseminating information about RCW 7.98, will establish a mechanism for individuals to report concerns and recommendations for implementation, and will develop a searchable database of certifying agencies and officials in the state of Washington.


4 Reporting
